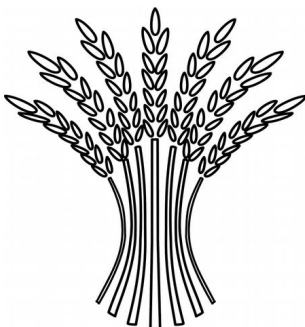


# We know not when our God will come
